

## **Eligibility for Sentencing to Service (STS)**

STS is a work program supervised by the Department of Corrections which allows inmates to work outside of the jail doing community work service. The STS program is a privilege and not a right. Strict adherence to the rules outlined in the Inmate Handbook and the standards of conduct while on STS are mandatory. All orders or directions of the STS crew leader will be followed while outside of this facility.

### **Pre-qualifications:**

- 1) Sentenced to 30 days or more with Judge's approval
- 2) Paid Booking Fee and other fees as required (May not have a negative account balance)
- 3) Pass urinalysis test (UA)
  - a. Must wait 2 weeks (14 days) to re-test. If unable to pass after 3<sup>rd</sup> test, STS will be denied.
  - b. UA test date may be delayed 30 days: Determined on a case-by-case basis.
  - c. False positive tests due to prescribed medication will be considered positive and disqualify you from privileges. Stopping prescribed medication to pass the test without medical approval will also result in disqualification.
- 4) Participants must provide their own clothing to wear while out of the facility. Two sets of clothing are recommended.
  - a. When dropping off clothes for an inmate, make sure to say it is for STS or it will not be accepted by jail staff.

### **Disqualifications:**

- 1) Child Support cases with cash bail. (No credit may be applied to any Child Support case)
- 2) Any escape or attempted escape from custody
- 3) Any previous or current sex offense(s) or Predatory Offender Registration (POR)
- 4) Reporting to jail to serve sentence under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs
- 5) Failure to report to jail to serve sentence as scheduled
- 6) Positive chemical test or failure to remain chemical free
- 7) Failure to pay required fees
- 8) Lack of adequate personal clothing for community service work
- 9) Other agency holds
- 10) Failure to post bail on an open file
- 11) Maximum classification
- 12) Criminal history; probation violations; failure to appear(s)
  - a. In consultation with Probation/Parole Agent
- 13) History of non-compliance during current or previous commitments
- 14) Failure to comply with detention rules:
  - a. 24 Hour Lockdown: Consequence determined on a case-by-case basis
  - b. 48 Hour Lockdown: Consequence determined on a case-by-case basis
  - c. 72 Hour Lockdown: Consequence determined on a case-by-case basis
  - d. Disciplinary Segregation (D-Seg): Disqualified for at least 30 days after sanction is completed
- 15) Failure to receive authorization from a team interview by detention staff and DOC
- 16) Other relevant factor
